Trailside Instructor



Position Summary:

As a Trailside instructor, you will be responsible for organizing games, leading crafts, outdoor activities, and homework support. Due to COVID-19 health mandates, all staff and campers must wear masks during outdoor activities and complete a health screening each day. As a TDC Instructor, you act as a positive role model for campers who cannot receive the social interaction and physical activity that comes with school in-person classes, sports, and activities. It is up to you to create a fun, safe, and supportive outdoor experience inclusive to all. We are flexible with online classes/other jobs/family requirements. All TDC staff must be CPR certified (course offerings can be available).

Pay is \$12.00-\$15 DOE.

1. Requirements

The Instructor must:

- 1. Have prior experience in environmental education, teaching, child care, or other related fields.
- 2. Have a valid certification in Adult and Child CPR and First Aid or be willing to attain it before the start of Fall Camp. Wilderness first aid preferred.
- 3. Must have reliable transportation to and from work.
- 4. Be 16 years or over. Drivers must be over 21 with a valid driver's license and a clean driving record.
- 5. Be willing to and follow all protocols outlined in TDC COVID-19 Mitigation Plan.

II. Program

Duties Include:

- 1. Maintaining the standards of the American Camping Association.
- 2. Working toward accomplishing the mission and goals of Trailside Discovery Camp and The Alaska Center.
- 3. Working with the Lead Environmental Education Instructor, EE Team Leader, Program Manager, and Camp Director to provide high-quality educational experiences to all Trailside Discovery Camp participants.
- 4. Preparing lesson plans and implementing environmental education programs and activities as needed.
- 5. Supervising participants and ensuring the safety of all staff and campers.

III. Child Care

Duties Include:

- 1. Recognizing and appropriately responding to hazards and emergencies.
- 2. Maintaining ACA standards for Instructor to camper ratios.
- 3. Encouraging the personal and social development of children.
- 4. Observing children and reporting all accidents, significant illnesses, and/or signs of physical, emotional, or sexual abuse to the Camp Director.
- 5. Running activities and lesson curriculum
- 6. Communicating with parents through group chat
- 7. Communicating with management about concerns
- 8. Youth behavior management
- 9. Ensuring all supplies, toys, and classrooms are clean and sanitized
- 10. Ensuring appropriate and realistic physical distancing
- 11. Overseeing appropriate youth hygiene practices
- IV. Records

Maintain accurate records:

- 1. Protect the confidentiality of the participant's records.
- 2. Filling out timesheets and Health screenings, and other paperwork accurately and efficiently.
- V. Supervision and Support

The Instructor will report directly to the Fall Program Director.

VI. Attendance

The Instructor must:

- 1. Complete health screening before the start of a shift.
- 2. Wear a face mask at all times, unless eating or drinking.
- 3. Attend all training sessions
- 4. Attend all staff meetings

VII. Miscellaneous

The Instructor must be willing and prepared to assume other appropriate duties as assigned by the Fall Program Director/ Camp Director.

Environmental Education Instructor Essential Functions

It is essential that the staff member:

- Arrive promptly for assigned shift and remain present for its entirety
- Remain with assigned group at all times, i.e., during snacks and all activities during the fall camp hours.
- Assist campers in following TDC COVID -19 mitigation plan protocols, including wearing face coverings, frequent hand sanitization, and social distancing.
- Assist campers in an emergency (fire, evacuation, illness, injury).
- Communicate effectively with campers, parents, staff, team leaders, Program Director and Camp Director.
- Provide support to the Fall Program Director.
- Supervise loading and unloading of camp vans when needed.
- Possess strength and endurance required to maintain constant supervision of campers.
- Appropriately respond to environmental, wildlife, and other natural hazards.
- Must be actively part of a group & supervise children at all times, including snack time, ceremonies, drop off and pick up, etc.
- Attend mandatory staff meetings and all other scheduled meetings throughout the fall.
- Sing songs and participate in ceremonies and TDC radio.
- Children will never be left alone or unattended at any time including bathroom breaks, running back inside to complete a mission, etc.
